<u>Attendance</u>: Students are recorded as absent by their homeroom teachers if they aren't in their homeroom by 8:40 am.

SAFE ARRIVAL: To report your child(ren) absent or late, you can use any of the following methods:

→ <u>Toll-Free Number</u>

Parents/guardians can call 1-833-582-6940 to report:

- Future absences using an automated system (max 5 consecutive days) at a time.
- Excuse your child(ren) for a <u>full day</u> (no half-day option). If they arrive late or after an appointment, their attendance will be updated in our system upon arrival.

→ <u>PowerSchool Parent/Student Portal</u>

Parents/guardians can log in to https://sishrsb.ednet.ns.ca/public/ to access the School Messenger website to report future absences.

→ <u>School Messenger App</u>

Parents/guardians can download the School Messenger app for Android and iOS devices and use their username and password for the PowerSchool Portal.

*All three methods are available 24 hours a day, 7 days per week. Absences can be reported any time before the start of school (9:10 am) on the day the student will be absent. Up to five consecutive absences can be recorded at once.

February is Registration Month

Do you have a child who will be starting pre-primary or primary this fall? It's time to register!

Registration for the 2025-26 school year begins on February 3. To ensure we have the right staff and supports in place for September, it's important that we gather enrolment numbers now.

Tip: Before you begin, make sure you have the following documents in electronic form (image, PDF or Word document):

- Proof of identity/age with one of the following: birth certificate, passport, immigration papers, or legal adoption papers) if you are new to the HRCE;
- Proof of home address (a recently dated official government or utility document with your current address that includes your name and date, such as water bill, power bill, internet bill, home fuel bill, a tax receipt, property assessment or a mortgage contract); and
- Nova Scotia Health Card or Canadian Province Health Card or, for non-citizens while in Canada, proof of Medical Insurance Information.

Badminton Tryouts

We will be selecting two teams: Juniors (Grades 7/8s) and Intermediates (Grade 9s) to represent Gorsebrook at the Metro Badminton Tournament. Each team will have 8 members that will play either: singles boys/girls, doubles boys/girls or mixed doubles. We will take 2 alternates for each team - so 20 players in total.

- Each age group (Junior 7/8s and Intermediate 9s) will get two tryouts and the teams will be posted by Wednesday, February 19th.
- Students should bring their racquets and court shoes if they have them.
- All tryouts will take place at school over lunch hour.
- Students need to arrive ready to play at noon with indoor or court shoes no boots allowed.
- All players taken on the team need to demonstrate the ability to consistently serve to their opponent.

-Grade 7/8s will try out on Tuesday, Feb 11th and Thursday, Feb 13nd. -Grade 9s will try out on Friday, February 14th and Tuesday, February 18th.

We will be keeping attendance at practices and team positions will be awarded based on skill and positive participation at practices.
