# Learning more about the Student Attendance and Engagement Policy

Did you know? The <u>Student Attendance and Engagement Policy</u> guides our approach to attendance and is in place to support all students.

The policy states that regular, punctual attendance supports academic success, responsibility, and preparation for the future.

Ensuring regular attendance is a joint effort between students, families and schools. As a parent/guardian, you play an important role by monitoring attendance, communicating with the school when your child is absent, and supporting your child's regular attendance.

#### What Should You Know?

#### Communication about absences

- o Schools will monitor attendance and lateness.
- All absences must be communicated to the school, following the school's procedure.
- If absenteeism or lateness reaches 10% of class time, the school will begin to engage more actively with the student and family.
- o If it goes beyond 15%, more targeted supports may be used (counselling, referrals, community supports)..



## **November 11 is Remembrance Day**

Remembrance Day holds an important place in our schools as it provides a meaningful opportunity for our students to learn about the sacrifices made by veterans and all those who have served in times of conflict. Through ceremonies, discussions and creative projects, we demonstrate respect and gratitude for the freedoms Canadians enjoy. Observing Remembrance Day also helps students connect with Canada's history and reinforces the values of peace, tolerance and community responsibility.

# **Safe Arrival Reminder**

Attendance: Students are recorded as absent by their teachers if they aren't in their first class by 8:40am.

**SAFE ARRIVAL:** To report your child(ren) absent or late, you can use any of the following methods:

- → Toll-Free Number: Parents/guardians can call 1-833-582-6940 to report:
  - Future absences using an automated system (max 5 consecutive days) at a time.
  - Excuse your child(ren) for a full day (no half-day option). If they arrive late or after an appointment, their attendance will be updated in our system upon arrival.
- → PowerSchool Parent/Student Portal: Parents/guardians can log in to https://sishrsb.ednet.ns.ca/public/ to access the School Messenger website to report future absences.
- → **School Messenger App:** Parents/guardians can download the School Messenger app for Android and iOS devices and use their username and password for the PowerSchool Portal.
- \*All three methods are available 24 hours a day, 7 days per week. Absences can be reported any time before the start of school (9:10 am) on the day the student will be absent. Up to five consecutive absences can be recorded at once. If your child will be absent for the afternoon only, please contact the main office at 902-421-6758 ext. 5451000.
